NETWORKS

Youth Conferences leverage relationships between the community, members of parliament, local councils, and interagency networks to deliver tangible outcomes for vulnerable communities. Members also have countless opportunities to meet and connect with other like-minded Members of Vinnies Youth through Social Justice events, social mixers and the annual NSW Youth Forum.

FACILITIES

Youth Conferences improve the quality of their support by using Vinnies Support Centres, hubs, meeting rooms and training kiosks. They identify community needs, develop support responses, access skills-based training, pastoral support, Vincentian formation, and develop leadership skills in environments that support learning and reflection.



YOUTH CONFERENCES IN ACTION

Some examples of campaigns and initiatives that Youth Conferences can be involved in are:

- Sleepouts to raise funds for people at risk of and already experiencing homelessness
- Community Closet and Book Swap Days to demonstrate the importance of upcycling
- Morning Teas with the Elderly to help foster connections with vulnerable members of the community
- Christmas Hamper Packing to provide hope and joy to people experiencing hardship during the festive season
