Vinnies School Social Justice Workshops

Our workshops are designed to facilitate meaningful engagement in social justice issues and provide opportunities for participants to put their faith into action.

School Social Justice Workshops include an introduction to the St Vincent de Paul Society and hands-on activities (with donated materials from your school) to support Vinnies good works.

Workshops are delivered in-person for primary and high school students, teacher, and parent groups.

School Social Justice Workshop topics include:

Housing and Homelessness, Poverty and Cost of Living, Human Dignity and Catholic Social Teaching (CST), Migrants and Refugees, Environmental Stewardship.

Individual students, parents, and teachers along with Mini Vinnies Groups, High School Conferences, Duke of Edinburgh and/or Community Services students can participate in the following volunteering opportunities:

SUPPORTING VINNIES RETAIL STORES

- Organise a collection of pre-loved goods (in good condition) to be collected at school, local organisation, or club. These can include clothes, shoes, handbags, jewellery, DVDs, games, crockery, books, toys, etc.
- Provide retail assistance in our Vinnies Retail Stores. Students are welcome to volunteer in our stores from 16 years of age, or from 14 years if they are participating in Duke of Edinburgh. <u>Vinnies Support Centres</u> are client-centered support and referral services operated by the St Vincent de Paul Society. They offer face to face support to those in the community who require financial, food or material assistance. The support teams work with our clients to offer the best possible assistance for their needs and connect them to the Society's Conference home visitation teams or Vinnies' Services.

As a <u>Vinnies Support Centre</u> volunteer, you will assist staff with providing advocacy, referrals and support to clients navigating the appropriate services. Vinnies have volunteer roles available including administration & reception support, assisting with client interview rosters, data entry and helping with ad hoc duties as requested. Vinnies Support Centres offer a friendly and supportive team environment, flexible volunteer hours (school hours available) and the opportunity to learn a variety of skills.
