

Workshops are in-person and are designed for all members of the school community — primary or secondary school students, teachers, staff, and parents.

Workshops begin with an introduction to the St Vincent de Paul Society and can include hands-on activities (with donated materials from your school) to support Vinnies good works.

BOOKING A WORKSHOP

All workshops are a minimum of 1 hour in length and require 4 weeks' notice.

Workshops incur a booking fee of \$200 (GST exempt) which will be invoiced to the school.



BUSKING FOR VINNIES

Busking for Vinnies has been a long-standing community outreach event, supported by City of Parramatta, held by the St Vincent de Paul Society NSW annually in Parramatta since the 1990s to raise awareness of the Society's services in the region.

In 2025, we are opening expressions of interest for additional school involvement in Parramatta and also other Council areas. The lunchtime student group musical performances accompanied by a Vinnies stall (run by Vinnies staff/members) are also a great way to engage with the local community and showcase the services that are available for people to access in the area, including our van services and support centres. Busking for Vinnies is held annually in August as an extension of Vinnies' Homelessness Week activities in Parramatta, but we are also seeking expressions of interest to expand this initiative as part of our Youth Week activities in April and Anti-Poverty Week in October.

High School / Youth Group Requirements:

- Public square performances are usually between 10:30am – 1:30pm
- Group of at least 10 (to approximately 40) students with 2 teacher/adult supervision
- School / Group to bring all musical and sound equipment (power available on-site)
- School / Group determined setlist of various sized group and solo performances


