Mini Vinnies Gathering – 24 July

220 people from 28 schools from across the Sydney, Parramatta and Broken Bay dioceses attended our annual Mini Vinnies Gathering at ACU Strathfield.



The day was a chance for students to reflect on how they are leaders of hope, supporting the work of Vinnies to offer support to those struggling in the local community. Students gained a greater understanding of the cost of living and the work of Vinnies Support Centres, housing and homelessness, stewardship and the Vinnies Van.

New Mini Vinnies Song Launched!




Cumberland Vinnies Van – Volunteers Needed

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SOCIAL JUSTICE WORKSHOPS



for students, teachers and parents

Our workshops are designed to facilitate meaningful engagement in social justice issues and provide opportunities for participants to put their faith into action.

Workshops are in-person and are designed for all members of the school community — primary or secondary school students, teachers, staff, and parents.

Workshops begin with an introduction to the St Vincent de Paul Society and can include hands-on activities (with donated materials from your school) to support Vinnies good works.

BOOKING A WORKSHOP

All workshops are a minimum of 1 hour in length and require 4 weeks' notice.

Workshops incur a booking fee of \$200 (GST exempt) which will be invoiced to the school.
