Canonisation of Pier Giorgio Frassati

On 7 September, Pier Giorgio Frassati was canonised in Rome, along with Carlo Acutis.

Pier Giorgio joined the St Vincent de Paul Society at 17 years of age and saw service as the highest expression of faith. His deep involvement drove him to become a mining engineer and actively promote Catholic Social Teaching. Known for his courage, charisma, and athletic pursuits, Pier Giorgio embodied Christian joy and selflessness.

Pier Giorgio was only 24 when he died. His devotion to the poor shone through simple acts of kindness and today he is recognised as the Patron of Vincentian Youth.

Workshops incur a booking fee of \$200 (GST exempt) which will be invoiced to the school.
